The Women's Foundation of Colorado Awards \$802,200 in Q4 Grants

35 Organizations Receiving Grants Help Fulfill WFCO's Mission to Help Women and Girls Achieve Economic Self-Sufficiency

DENVER (Jan. 15, 2016) —Today, <u>The Women's Foundation of Colorado</u> announced it awarded \$802,200 in Q4 2015 to 35 nonprofit organizations across the state. The organizations provide programs that help fulfill WFCO's mission of leading change and building resources so every woman and girl in Colorado achieves her full potential. Women, girls, and families in more than 16 Colorado counties — from La Plata to Larimer — will benefit from the grantees' programs, in addition to many grantees statewide that work on their behalf through public policy and advocacy.

Each grantee supports one of WFCO's impact areas to help women and girls achieve economic self-sufficiency, which include:

- 1. Keeping girls in school, so they are prepared for college or career.
- 2. Helping single moms succeed though job training and education.
- 3. Paving the way for women and girls to enter, succeed, and advance in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) fields, where salaries are greater.
- 4. Developing girls as leaders to drive change in their own communities.

"We know that when women prosper, families, communities, and the entire economy are more likely to prosper," said WFCO President and CEO, Lauren Y. Casteel. "Our community partners are doing essential work to remove systemic barriers and open doors for women and girls so they can move toward economic independence and their families can thrive. We're thrilled that many of our grantees have a two-generation focus, helping to create opportunities for women and their children, too."
