Colorado Women's Chamber honors Elbra Wedgeworth as ATHENA Award Recipient at Gala

DENVER, CO – April 25, 2013 – The Colorado Women's Chamber of Commerce (CWCC) named Elbra Wedgeworth, Chief Government and Community Affairs Officer at Denver Health, the 2013 ATHENA recipient on April 25th at the ATHENA Award Gala.

The 2013 ATHENA Award is given to an outstanding woman leader who demonstrates excellence, creativity and initiative in their business or profession, provides valuable service to improve the quality of life for others in their community and assists women in reaching their full leadership potential.

Wedgeworth has had a remarkable and inspiring professional career as a government leader and public servant. She served in all three branches of city government before she was elected to City Council in her home district, District Eight. As a council woman, Wedgeworth represented 22 neighborhood organizations. She over saw the redevelopment of East Village, Dahlia Square Shopping Center, Mercy Hospital and various other projects in District 8.

In addition to her City Council work, Wedgeworth helped Denver to successfully land the bid for Denver to host the 2008 Democratic National Convention.

Her work in the community has earned Wedgeworth many awards including the Marin Luther King Humanitarian Award, named by CWCC as one of the Top 25 Most Powerful Women in Denver, the Author C. Jones Spirit Awards and the Heart of Volunteerism Award to name a few.

In addition to Wedgeworth, the 2013 finalists included Louise Atkinson, President and CEO, The Women's Foundation of Colorado; Sheila Gutterman, President and Co-Founder, Gutterman Griffiths PC; Denise Maes, Director of Public Policy, ACLU; and Christine, Marquez-Hudson, CEO/Executive Director, Mi Casa Resource Center. A special panel of business and community leaders chose the ATHENA Award finalists from nominations submitted by the Denver business community.
