Women & Girls of Color Fund Community Feedback

Several Women & Girls of Color Fund Year 2 grantees collected feedback directly from their community members, staff, and volunteers. The following community members' feedback highlights how grantee organizations led by women and nonbinary leaders of color are serving their communities in unique, liberatory ways.

Community members shared three words that describe how Women & Girls of Color Fund and its grantee organizations have impacted them.

Advocate for and cultivate safe, accessible spaces and programming for community members.

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The leadership team and its board are made up of women, women who for the first time participate in a community team, who for the first time speak publicly about their needs and how they could be solved. For the first time we can have access to classes in Spanish, on topics that interest us and that will help us develop skills to be able to have a little more economic income, thanks to our Trade Classes project. We hold community events, which allow us to share cultural diversity, where we involve our youth and children so that they feel proud of being bicultural. Garfield School District 16 has had important changes in communication with parents who do not speak English, thanks to our Colorado River Valley Team, we can now have interpreters at our parent-teacher conferences, it is no longer our children who interpret. We also achieved that for the first time, the 2023 high school graduation was with simultaneous interaction in Spanish.

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The women of color that lead the organization are representatives of the community they serve, and they are role models for young girls. The capacity building trainings that CRVT has offered this year have been transformative for the (mainly female) participants by giving them an opportunity to learn and grow in a community-based, welcoming learning environment.
